
- How can we be prepared for sonship?
- Preparation with help from tutors
- Preparation through entering rest
- Preparation through soul transformation at different levels
- Deconstruction of the mind





- Deconstructing the mind will involve religious deprogramming that will challenge our theology and doctrines
- Face to face encounters with the true nature of God will inevitably create cognitive dissonance
- Discovering the true reality of who
 God is by experience will change us

- As God began the deconstruction process it inevitably changed how I saw the Bible and its role in my life
- Hermeneutical frameworks influences our exegetical understanding of the Bible and therefore create belief systems that can limit the scope of our sonship and restoration

 Rom 8:16 The Spirit Himself testifies with our spirit that we are children of God, 17 and if children, heirs also, heirs of God and fellow heirs with Christ, if indeed we suffer with Him so that we may also be glorified with Him.

Rom 8:19 For the anxious longing of the creation waits eagerly for the revealing of the sons of God. 20 For the creation was subjected to futility, not willingly, but because of Him who subjected it, in hope 21 that the creation itself also will be set free from its slavery to corruption into the freedom of the glory of the children of God.

- Our sonship is inextricably linked to creation's freedom and restoration
- What we believe will inevitably hinder, restrict, limit or help in the process of the restoration of all things that as sons we have a coheirship of

- Some specific areas of doctrine and theology influence our thinking about the scope of what can be restored and our involvement in it.
- Many of the doctrines I was taught in the evangelical, Brethren and charismatic streams limited the scope of restoration

- Some areas that we will have been influenced by include:
- Our initial religious upbringing or first church steam experiences
- Catholic or Protestant
- Catholic Roman or Orthodox
- Protestant Reformed, Evangelical,
 Charismatic, Pentecostal, Trinitarian

- Calvinism and Arminianism
- Determinism or free will
- Dispensationalism or Covenant theology
- Literal, figurative interpretation
- Many positions are paradoxical and therefore contradictory but all sides use the Bible to prove their position

- Specific theological frameworks of eschatology and prophetic interpretation will influence our understand and often create confirmational bias views that limit us
- We need face to face encounters with God Himself to replace our theology with relationship in love

- Son there are many streams coming together that are mostly blind to the direction that others are traveling from but they will merge in the flow of the restoration of all things.
- Son restoration is My desire but this must also encompasses both eschatology and the supernatural realms.

- Son the three streams of thought that are converging to give a framework of agreement and government will be the foundation for a whole new era where My children will come into the maturity of sonship.
- Creation is waiting for the revealing of the sons of God for its freedom so it is time to grow up and love

- The Christian universalists are traveling towards both realised eschatology and an open heaven mystical flow.
- The mystical are travelling towards realised eschatology and universal restoration.
- The realised eschatologists are travelling towards the mystical and the restoration of all things position.

- These 3 positions are inevitably meeting together into a unified whole. At present there are those who hold 2 positions but few who hold three positions but the realisation and revelation is beginning to dawn but the deconstruction has yet to fully take place.
- Many are unwilling to embrace some of the positions because they have not seen Me face to face.

- The reason, why the earth does not look like heaven yet is, because it is our job to take into possession the inheritance of Christ (as the father sent me, so do I send you / making disciples of all nations).
- It is like the promised land: It was all given to Israel legally, but at the same time they had to conquer it. Everything is ours, but not everything is taken yet – Bruno Zimmerli

- The restoration of all things is not a one off event but is a continual process that God does with us in us and through us as His sons
- I believe as coheirs we are involved and carry responsibility for the restoration of all things and specifically for creation's restoration

- When I was baptised in the Spirit in 1986
 God immediately got my attention by
 challenging me to understand both the
 concepts of kingdom and covenant
- The long journey of deconstruction began in earnest and started with my eschatology but that was just the beginning of how deep the rabbit hole went as I was removed from the religious matrix that deceived me

- How the Bible frames our understanding of our future will greatly influence what we believe about our sonship and what is possible in restoration
- Our expectations of the future will also determine what we will believe about our part in its fulfilment

- If we believe that God is going to destroy the heavens and the earth with fire as many do that will affect how we see our responsibility to steward the planet and its resources
- If you believe in a defeatist rapture rescue of the church into heaven then there will be little point in the kingdom filling the earth in victory

- The views we have about the future primarily come from what the Bible says or what someone may have prophesied
- Study of Bible prophecy and the last days is called eschatology
- Remember that all the NT was future to the OT writers and what Jesus prophesied was future to the hearers

- What was future to both OT or NT writers may not be future to us today it may have already occurred
- Is Biblical prophecy not yet fulfilled, partially fulfilled, totally fulfilled or being fulfilled?
- We still need a clear idea of God's original intention even if Bible prophecy is fulfilled or being fulfilled

- The fulfilment of prophecy does not limit God unless He specifies it
- Our key question should not be what the Bible is saying about what God is doing in our generation but what is God saying to us directly Himself
- The heart of God for restoration is clearly revealed in the Bible but the specifics of restoration may not be

- As sons we need a restoration mindset if we are to participate in the expansion of God's kingdom and therefore the restoration of all things
- Which eschatological belief systems best aligns with creation being set free from corruption within the restoration of all things?

- What is a happy, realised, fulfilled or covenant eschatology?
- Most eschatological systems have far from happy endings for some or most people and created beings
- Most eschatological systems have expectations of fearful judgment, doom, gloom, destruction and failure for mankind

- In happy eschatology there is a more optimistic view of the future by seeing the doom and gloom, judgment and destruction as things that have already been fulfilled leading to a restorative period where all things can be restored
- The future is positive and filled with possibilities of increase and blessing

- In a happy, realised, fulfilled or covenant eschatology all references to the end, last days, end times, last hour, soon to take place are all referring to the end of the old covenant that Jesus prophesied would occur in that generation
- There is no fear for the future based on Biblical prophecy if it is past for us

- The end is past not future
- The end of the old heavens and earth is past not future
- The new heavens and the new earth is present not future
- The great tribulation is past not future
- The end of the age is past not future
- Judgment and resurrection are past not future

- Matt 24:34 Truly I say to you, this generation will not pass away until all these things take place. 35 Heaven and earth will pass away, but My words will not pass away.
- Matt 24:21 For then there will be a great tribulation, such as has not occurred since the beginning of the world until now, nor ever will.

- That great tribulation as prophesied has already occurred and will never be repeated again to fulfil prophecy and be the end of the old covenant
- That does not mean that there will never be any tribulation again throughout history but if there is tribulation it will not be a fulfilment of Bible prophecy or this specific passage

 Matt 24:2 And He said to them, "Do you not see all these things? Truly I say to you, not one stone here will be left upon another, which will not be torn down."3 As He was sitting on the Mount of Olives, the disciples came to Him privately, saying, "Tell us, when will these things happen, and what will be the sign of Your coming, and of the end of the age?"

- Matt 24:3 And when he is sitting on the mount of the Olives, the disciples came near to him by himself, saying, 'Tell us, when shall these be? and what [is] the sign of thy presence, and of the completion of the age?'
- Parousia is presence not coming therefore it is present and not future

- If these things are still future as some eschatological systems believe then yes Jesus must have lied but of course Jesus is the Truth and cannot lie so it must be our interpretation which is in error
- That future interpretation is still a problem for Jews and Muslims who say Jesus was a false prophet because He lied about that generation fulfilment

- Matt 10:22 You will be hated by all because of My name, but it is the one who has endured to the end who will be saved.
- "The 'end of the age' means the close of the epoch or age - that is, the Jewish age or dispensation which was drawing nigh, as our Lord frequently intimated.

- All those passages that speak of 'the end,' 'the end of the age,' or 'the ends of the ages,' refer to the same completion or consummation, and it is always as nigh and at hand."
- There was clear expectation that these things were near and a warning to be ready and prepared

 Matt 22:15 "Therefore when you see the abomination of desolation which was spoken of through Daniel the prophet, standing in the holy place (let the reader understand), 16 then those who are in Judea must flee to the mountains. 17 Whoever is on the housetop must not go down to get the things out that are in his house.

 Matt 22:18 Whoever is in the field must not turn back to get his cloak. 19 But woe to those who are pregnant and to those who are nursing babies in those days! 20 But pray that your flight will not be in the winter, or on a Sabbath.

- Every believer in Jerusalem who endured to the end knew to look for those signs and they all fled to Pella a mountain town and were saved
- According to Josephus no Christians died in the destruction of Jerusalem but 300,000 + of those who did not belief were thrown into the fires of a literal Gehenna rubbish dump

- Matt 24:22 Unless those days had been cut short, no life would have been saved; but for the sake of the elect those days will be cut short
- Matt 24:27 For just as the lightning comes from the east and flashes even to the west, so will the coming of the Son of Man be. 28 Wherever the corpse is, there the vultures will gather.

- Matt 24:34 Truly I say to you, this generation will not pass away until all these things take place. 35 Heaven and earth will pass away, but My words will not pass away.
- Josephus even records visions over Jerusalem in the clouds of Jesus coming

- Matt 5:17 "Do not think that I came to abolish the Law or the Prophets; I did not come to abolish but to fulfil. 18 For truly I say to you, until heaven and earth pass away, not the smallest letter or stroke shall pass from the Law until all is accomplished.
- Are we still under the law today?

- Heb 8:13 When He said, "A new covenant," He has made the first obsolete. But whatever is becoming obsolete and growing old is ready to disappear.
- Heaven and earth as still here so either we are still under the law or this is figurative not literal

- "Heaven and earth" is referring to the old covenant system.
- When the old covenant "heaven and earth" passed in AD 70, the new covenant "new heavens and earth" wineskin was established.
- This is not discussing the end of planet earth the world or the universe

- Apocalyptic/prophetic/symbolic language – When we read that Jesus is coming on the clouds and stars are falling from the heavens in Matthew 24 we should realize this is the language of the OT prophets.
- In the OT when God came riding upon the clouds in judgment rolling up the heavens like a scroll, this was symbolic language depicting the fall and judgment of nations (not literal and physical).

- In Daniel chapters 7, 9 and 12 the consummation of the major eschatological events can be found
- Daniel connected the eschatological time of the "end" with events such as the desolation of the temple, the resurrection, the tribulation, the coming of the Son of man and the arrival of the kingdom

 All those events would take place when the city and temple would be destroyed or "when the power of the holy people would be completely shattered" "all these things" (not some of them) would be fulfilled together (cf. see the consummation scenes in Dan. 12:1-7; Dan. 7:13-14, 18, 27; 9:24-27).

- In Matthew 13:39-43, 51 Jesus taught that the judgment and resurrection ("the time of the end" eschatological events) would take place at the end of their old covenant "this age."
- Jesus specifically asks them if they understood His teaching on the time of this harvest at the end of their "this age" and they emphatically responded "Yes" (vs. 51).

- Jesus had previously taught that He would return in some of their lifetimes (Matthew 10:22-23; 16:27-28/Mark 8:38-9:1)
- Jesus previously taught them that all the blood from righteous Abel (from Genesis up to those He would send to them) would be avenged when the temple was destroyed in their "this generation" (Matthew 23:30-36, 38)

 Isaiah 24-28 shows all of the eschatological events (judgment, decreation, dealing with the sin of blood guilt, the blowing of the trumpet, the resurrection, etc...) to take place together when the temple would be destroyed or "when he makes all the altar stones to be like chalk stones crushed to pieces" (Isaiah 27:9).

- Jesus had already taught them that some of them would live to witness His return and the destruction of the Temple.
- Therefore, they were NOT mistaken to associate and connect Jesus' coming (to destroy the Temple [that they were looking at and discussing] in their generation) with His coming and the end of the age.

- If heaven and earth had to pass before the Old Law could pass; and if heaven and earth refers to literal, physical heaven and earth, then, since literal, physical heaven and earth still exist, (have not passed), it must be true that the Old Law has not passed and is still in effect.
- This is a wrong assumption

- On the other hand, if we understand the "heaven and earth" as figurative language referring not to physical creation, but to something else, it is possible that this "heaven and earth" could pass away, allowing for the passing of the Law.
- Isa 24:5,19 Isa 51:16

- Isa 24:19 The earth is broken asunder, The earth is split through, The earth is shaken violently
- Now this sounds like the destruction of material creation but closer examination reveals it to be speaking of the destruction of Israel's Covenant World under the imagery of "heaven and earth".

- Isa 24:5 The earth is also polluted by its inhabitants, for they transgressed laws, violated statutes, broke the age enduring covenant.
- This is the reason for the destruction they have broken the age enduring covenant.
- God was going to destroy "heaven and earth" because Israel had broken her covenant with Jehovah.

 Another example of "heaven and earth" referring to the Covenant World of Israel and not literal creation is Isaiah 51:16. "I have put my word in your mouth and have covered you with the shadow of my hand, to establish the heavens, to found the earth, and to say to Zion, 'You are my people". (NASV)

- Clearly God is not saying he gave the Mosaic Covenant to Israel to create literal heaven and earth! Material creation existed long before Israel was ever given the Mosaic Covenant.
- Heaven and earth referred to the old covenant system symbolised by temple (the place where heaven and earth met)

- The Mosaic Covenant, the same law Jesus is speaking about in Matthew 5:17
- The meaning of the verse is that God gave his covenant with Israel to create their world — a covenant world with Him.

- God created Israel's "heaven and earth" by giving them his Covenant.
- Now if He destroyed that Old Covenant heaven and earth and gave a New Covenant, would He not thereby be creating a new heavens and new earth?
- Yes

- Old Israel's covenant was about to pass away, 2 Corinthians 3:10ff; Hebrews 8:13; 12:25ff.
- The New Covenant of Christ was being given, Ephesians 3:3ff; Hebrews 2:1ff.
- Since the giving of Covenant created "heaven and earth" the New Heaven and Earth of Christ would not fully come until the New Covenant was completely revealed.

 2 Peter 3:10 But the day of the Lord will come like a thief, in which the heavens will pass away with a roar and the elements will be destroyed with intense heat, and the earth and its works will be burned up. 13 But according to His promise we are looking for new heavens and a new earth, in which righteousness dwells.

- It therefore follows that if the New Heavens and Earth of Christ has not arrived then Christ's New Covenant has not yet been fully revealed.
- If Christ's New Covenant has been fully revealed then the new heavens and new earth have already come.


- Consider this carefully in light of 2 Peter 3 and Revelation 21-22, passages written as the process of revealing the New Covenant was yet incomplete.
- Matt 24:35 Heaven and earth will pass away, but My words will not pass away.
- Heaven and earth have now passed away and all prophetic promises are fulfilled in Christ in the new covenant

- In Isaiah 51:5-6 God predicted the "heaven and earth" would vanish. This is the same "heaven and earth" he had established at Sinai.
- This is not a prediction of the passing of literal heaven and earth--it is a prediction of the passing of the Old World of Israel so that the New Covenant World of Jesus would be established.


- This heaven and earth that Isaiah said would perish is the same heaven and earth Jesus said must pass before the Old Law would pass.
- The end has ended the last hour of the last day has gone
- We live in the New Covenant of grace and are not under the law

- Matt 16:27 For the Son of Man is going to come in the glory of His Father with His angels, and will then repay every man according to his deeds. 28 "Truly I say to you, there are some of those who are standing here who will not taste death until they see the Son of Man coming in His kingdom."
- Judgement is already passed

Fulfilled Eschatology Overview



The Bible divides time into (2) worlds (ages): "this age" and "the age to come". They correspond with the Old and New Covenant ages. The New Testament was written during the "LAST DAYS" of the Old Covenant age or what THEY called "this age". The Last Days of the Old Covenant age were the 40-year transition that ended when the Temple was destroyed - ending the Old Covenant Law and blood sacrifices.








